4. Andrea Dovizioso, Ducati Team – Age: 34 – Nationality: Italian

-Dovizioso had two podium finishes at Jerez in the smaller classes – third in the 250cc races in both 2006 and 2007.
 -His best result from 12 starts in the MotoGP® class at Jerez is fourth last year after qualifying fourth, when he also equalled his best qualifying result at the track in the class from 2016.
 -In 2016, Dovizioso failed to score any points for the first time in Jerez; he retired from the race after coolant leaked onto his rear tyre.
 -In 2018, he crashed out of the race following an incident with Jorge Lorenzo and Dani Pedrosa at Turn 6 on Lap 18.
 -Jerez is the only one circuit on the 2020 calendar where he has not had a podium in the MotoGP® class, along with Kymiing.

5. Johann Zarco, Reale Avintia Racing – Age: 30 – Nationality: French

-Zarco has competed at Jerez previously in both the smaller classes with two podium finishes; third in 125cc in 2011, and second in 2015 in Moto2®.
 -2017 was Zarco's first year competing at Jerez in MotoGP®; he qualified in sixth on the grid and crossed the line in fourth as the top Independent Team rider, top rookie and the highest Yamaha rider in his best result in the premier class at that time.
 -In 2018, he started from the front row for the eighth successive time in Jerez and crossed the line in second as the highest-placed Yamaha and Independent Team rider, equalling his best result from Argentina earlier that year.
 -In 2019, he qualified 18th, made his way through the field to finish 14th as the second-placed KTM rider behind his teammate Pol Espargaro.

9. Danilo Petrucci, Ducati Team – Age: 29 – Nationality: Italian

-In 2014, he missed the race at Jerez after crashing on Sunday morning Warm Up and fracturing his right wrist.
 -Petrucci missed the race at Jerez in 2016 whilst recovering from an operation on his hand; he was replaced by Michele Pirro.
 -In 2017, he started from 13th on the grid and crossed the line in seventh after battling with Valentino Rossi.
 -In 2018, he qualified in ninth and finished the race in fourth as the top Ducati rider after battling with Andrea Iannone and Valentino Rossi. This is his best result at Jerez so far.
 -Last year, he qualified in seventh after crashing after the chequered flag in Q2 and crossed the line in fifth as the second-placed Ducati rider behind his teammate Dovizioso.

12. Maverick Viñales, Monster Energy Yamaha MotoGP – Age: 25 – Nationality: Spanish

-Viñales won the Moto3® race at Jerez in 2013 on his way to taking the world title.
 -In 2015, he started the MotoGP® race from 14th on the grid after a crash in qualifying; he went on to finish in 11th.
 -In 2016, he qualified in fifth and finished the race in sixth, just behind his teammate Aleix Espargaro.
 -In 2017, he also crossed the line in sixth place, after starting from fourth on the grid.
 -In 2018, he qualified in 11th, dropped down to 13th after struggling in the early stages of the race and eventually crossed the line in seventh.
 -Last year, he qualified fifth after passing through Q1. He finished the race in third, which is his only podium on home soil so far since he stepped up to the MotoGP® class in 2015.

20. Fabio Quartararo, Petronas Yamaha SRT – Age: 21 – Nationality: French

-In 2015, Quartararo just missed out on the podium in the Moto3® race in Jerez following a last-lap battle, finishing in fourth. This is his best result at the track so far.
 -In 2016, he qualified in 11th, crashed on the opening lap and remounted but eventually retired from the race.
 -Quartararo's best result in Jerez in the Moto2® class is 10th in 2018, from 17th on the grid.
 -2019 was Quartararo's first race in Jerez in MotoGP®; he qualified on pole position for the first time in the class, setting a new all-time lap record in Jerez.
 -Aged 20 years and 14 days old at that time, Quartararo became the youngest rider to qualify on pole position in the class, beating the record set by Marc Marquez (20 years and 62 days old) in Austin back in 2013.
 -He retired from the race on the back straight on Lap 14 due to a mechanical problem with the gear shifter while sitting in second place.

21. Franco Morbidelli, Petronas Yamaha SRT – Age: 25 – Nationality: Italian

-Morbidelli competed at Jerez in Moto2® from 2014 to 2017; his best result to date is a fourth-place finish back in 2016 from fourth on the grid.
 -In 2017, he qualified in second place but crashed out of the race after taking the lead from his teammate Alex Marquez on Lap 9.
 -2018 was Morbidelli's first time competing in MotoGP® at Jerez; he finished the race in ninth, which was the first top 10 finish of his rookie season.
 -Last year, he qualified second which is his best qualifying result in MotoGP® (later equalled in Japan). This was his first front start since he stepped to the MotoGP® class in 2018. He went to finishing the race in seventh.

-Lecuona raced in Jerez in the FIM CEV Moto2® European Championship in 2016 and finished the race in seventh.
 -Lecuona has competed in Jerez for the last three years in Moto2®, with a best result of ninth in 2018.
 -In 2017, he retired from the race after struggling with several injuries sustained during preseason testing at Jerez.
 -Last year, he qualified in 16th and finished the race in 10th as the second-placed KTM rider across the line.
 -In 2020, Lecuona will be racing in Jerez for the first time on a MotoGP® bike.

-In 2013, Nakagami qualified third on the Moto2® grid and crossed the line in fourth after being passed by Pol Espargaro two laps before the end – his best result at this track.
 -In 2017, he finished 21st from eighth on the grid in Moto2® after Corsi made contact with him at Turn 6 on the third lap.
 -2018 was the first time that Nakagami competed in the MotoGP® class at Jerez; he finished the race in 12th, which was his best result across the line at the time of his rookie season.
 -Last year, he qualified in eighth, which was his best qualifying result at that time in MotoGP®, and finished the race in ninth after dropping down to 12th in the early stages.

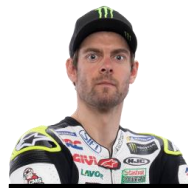

- In 2017, Binder missed the Moto2[™] race in Jerez following an arm injury sustained during preseason testing in Valencia that required surgery after the Argentinian GP; he was replaced by Ricky Cardus.
- In 2018, he started from fifth on the grid and finished the race in sixth
- Last year, Binder started from 10th and finished the race in fifth as the highest-placed KTM rider across the line.
- In 2020, Binder will be racing in Jerez for the first time on a MotoGP[™] bike.

35. Cal Crutchlow, LCR Honda Castrol – Age: 34 – Nationality: British

- In 2011, his first race at the Jerez circuit, Crutchlow finished eighth after crashing and remounting.
- He has been the first Independent Team rider across the line on three occasions at Jerez: in 2012 he was fourth, 2013 in fifth and 2015 in fourth.
- In 2016, he picked up his first points of the season when he finished in 11th place.
- In 2017, he qualified on the front row for the first time at this track. He crashed out of the race at Turn 11 on Lap 6 while trying to close the gap to Zarco for third place.
- In 2018, Crutchlow qualified on pole position in Jerez for the fourth time of his Grand Prix career but crashed out of the race on Lap 8 at Turn 1 while sitting in fourth, struggling with his front tyre.
- Last year, he qualified sixth; he finished the race in eighth after choosing the medium rear tyre.

36. Joan Mir, Team Suzuki Ecstar – Age: 22 – Nationality: Spanish

- Mir won the second Red Bull MotoGP Rookies Cup race in Jerez back in 2014.
- Mir raced twice in Moto3[™] at Jerez in 2016 and in 2017; he took his best result in 2017 crossing the line in third. He both qualified and finished the race in sixth place in 2016.
- In 2018, Mir started from sixth as the top rookie rider on the grid; he finished the race in 11th.
- 2019 was Mir's first race in Jerez on a MotoGP[™] bike, he joined Q2 directly for the second time in his rookie season and qualified in 12th. He crashed out of the race at Turn 13 with five laps to go while sitting in ninth.

38. Bradley Smith, Aprilia Racing Team Gresini – Age: 29 – Nationality: British

- Smith won the 125cc GP at Jerez in 2009 – his first victory in Grand Prix racing
- In 2011, he finished fourth at Jerez in just his second race in Moto2[™].
- In 2013, Smith was 10th at Jerez in his third race in the MotoGP[™] class.
- His best result from seven visits to Jerez in MotoGP[™] is eighth, taken in both 2014 & 2015
- In 2017, Smith finished the race at Jerez in 14th after starting from 16th place on the grid.
- In 2018, he qualified in 21st and made his way through the field to cross the line in 13th as the third KTM rider.
- Last year as a wildcard for Aprilia, he crashed in FP2 after hitting some debris that was left on the track after Abraham's crash; he managed to qualify in 19th despite the pain. He finished the race in 17th after choosing the medium rear tyre and dropping down to 22nd in the early stages.

41. Aleix Espargaro, Aprilia Racing Team Gresini – Age: 30 – Nationality: Spanish

- In 2012, Aleix Espargaro was the first CRT rider across the line at Jerez in 12th place, and again in 2013 when he finished ninth.
- In 2014, he was the first Open Class bike across the line at the Spanish GP in seventh.
- In 2015, he finished in seventh once again but this time on the Suzuki, after qualifying in sixth.
- In 2016, he finished the race in fifth, his best GP result at the track from 14 starts across the three classes.
- In 2017, he said the race in Jerez was one of the most difficult in his career, but he managed to move up to ninth after dropping down to 15th on the second lap.
- In 2018, he qualified in 13th, but retired from the race on the opening lap with a technical problem.
- Last year, he qualified in 16th and finished the race in 11th as the highest-placed Aprilia rider, despite a collision with Miller during the race and struggling in the early stages to find traction.

42. Alex Rins, Team Suzuki Ecstar – Age: 24 – Nationality: Spanish

- Rins raced three times at Jerez in Moto3[™], with a best result of third in 2014.
- He competed in Moto2[™] in 2015 and 2016 at Jerez; finishing 18th in 2015, after crashing at the final corner and remounting, and finishing third the following year.
- 2018 was the first time that Rins competed in MotoGP[™] at Jerez, as he missed the Spanish GP in 2017 due to a left wrist injury sustained in Austin. He qualified in sixth as the top Suzuki rider on the grid, but crashed out of the race, losing the front at Turn 11 with 20 laps remaining.
- Last year, he qualified ninth and finished second which was his second successive podium finish after winning his first MotoGP[™] race in Austin.

43. Jack Miller, Pramac Racing – Age: 25 – Nationality: Australian

- Miller qualified on pole for the Moto3[™] race in 2014 at Jerez; he finished the race in fourth.
- In 2015, his rookie year in MotoGP[™]; Miller finished down in 20th position after running wide mid-race.
- In 2016, he finished the race in 17th, struggling with an injury picked up from a crash in Austin.
- In 2017, he crashed out on Lap 6 after a collision with Bautista at the first corner.
- In 2018, Miller qualified in 12th and made his way through the field to cross the line in sixth place after battling with Valentino Rossi – his best result in the class at the track.
- Last year, he qualified in 15th after struggling with the wind in Q1. He worked his way through the field but crashed out of race with three laps to go while trying to overtake A. Espargaro at Turn 13.

44. Pol Espargaro, Red Bull KTM Factory Racing – Age: 29 – Nationality: Spanish

- Pol Espargaro won the 125cc GP race at Jerez in 2010 and won the Moto2[™] race there in 2012 – his first victory in the Moto2[™] class.
- In 2014 he finished ninth in the MotoGP[™] class at Jerez, after getting a bad start and dropping down to 12th in the early stages.
- In 2015, he finished the race in fifth position, his equal best result of 2015.
- In 2016, he finished in eighth as the top Independent Team rider.
- In 2017, Espargaro crashed out of the race on Lap 6 after starting from 15th on the grid.
- In 2018, he qualified in 16th and finished the race in 11th as the second-placed KTM rider just behind Mika Kallio.
- Last year, he qualified in 17th place and for the race, he was the highest-placed KTM rider in 13th after misreading his pit board and easing off a lap earlier.

46. Valentino Rossi, Monster Energy Yamaha MotoGP – Age: 41 – Nationality: Italian

- Rossi has a great record at Jerez with seven victories and five other podium finishes from his 20 starts at the circuit in the premier class.
- He also won in both the 125cc and 250cc classes at Jerez, giving him a total of nine GP victories at this track.
- In 2015, Rossi finished in third position when he became the first rider in history to reach the milestone of 200 GP podium finishes.
- In 2016, Rossi qualified on pole for the first time at the track since 2005 and went on to win at Jerez for the first time since 2009.
- In 2017, he headed the third row of the grid, eventually finishing 10th.
- In 2018, he started from 10th and finished the race in fifth as the second Yamaha rider.
- Last year, he missed Q2 after passing through Q1; he started from 13th, which was his worst qualifying in Jerez since he was also 13th at the track back in 2012 riding a Ducati. He crossed the line in sixth as second Yamaha rider after choosing the hard rear tyre.

- Rabat has finished on the podium three times at Jerez: third in the 125cc class in 2010, a race win in 2013 and a third-place finish in 2015 in Moto2[™].
- Rabat has also started from pole twice in the Moto2[™] class at Jerez, in 2013 & 2015.
- In 2016 and 2017, competing in the MotoGP[™] class at Jerez, Rabat failed to score any points; he was 18th in 2016 and crashed out of the race on Lap 10 in 2017 after moving up to 13th from 18th on the grid.

- From 2013 to 2016, Bagnaia raced in Moto3[™] in Jerez with a best result of third coming in 2016 – the third podium finish of his GP career – from third on the grid.

73. Alex Marquez, Repsol Honda Team – Age: 24 – Nationality: Spanish

- Marquez made his GP debut at Jerez in Moto3[™] back in 2012 as a wildcard; he qualified 13th and finished 12th.
- Marquez' best result in Jerez in the Moto3[™] class is seventh in 2014, from seventh on the grid, on his way to clinching the title.
- Marquez won in Jerez in Moto2[™] in 2017 from pole position, his first win and first pole position since he stepped up to Moto2[™] in 2015.
- Last year, he qualified second in Moto2[™], but crashed on the opening lap after being unable to avoid Remy Gardner's bike. The race was red-flagged and Marquez, who injured a finger in the process, had to start from the pitlane; he eventually finished 24th.
- 2020 will be Marquez' first race in Jerez on a MotoGP[™] bike.

- Oliveira has competed in Jerez for the last nine years with a best result of second in Moto3[™] back in 2015 and second in Moto2[™] in 2018.
- In 2017, he finished third in the Moto2[™] race in Jerez after qualifying in fourth place.
- Oliveira qualified on the front row in Jerez in 2012 and 2015, both in the Moto3[™] class.
- In 2019, Oliveira raced in Jerez for the first time on a MotoGP[™] bike; he started from 22nd ahead of his teammate Syahrin and finished the race in 18th.

93. Marc Marquez, Repsol Honda Team – Age: 27 – Nationality: Spanish

- Marquez only reached the finish line in the intermediate and lightweight classes of GP racing at Jerez twice: third in the 125cc race in 2009 and second in the Moto2[™] race in 2012.
- In 2013, he passed Lorenzo at the final corner to finish in second place.
- In 2014, he qualified on pole and took his first GP win in any class at Jerez.
- In 2015 he finished in second at Jerez, despite riding with a broken finger on his left hand.
- In 2016, Marquez finished in third place at Jerez, struggling with the front tyre - his worst result across the line at this track since he stepped up to the MotoGP[™] class in 2013.
- In 2017, he crossed the line in second position from second on the grid.
- In 2018, he won the race in Jerez after qualifying in fifth.
- Last year, Marquez started from third and won the race, which was his seventh podium finish in the class at this track.
