4. Andrea Dovizioso, Ducati Team – Age: 34 – Nationality: Italian

- Dovizioso finished second at Brno on three occasions in the smaller classes, on each occasion behind Jorge Lorenzo; in the 125cc class in 2004 and in the 250cc race in 2006 and 2007.
- He has had three podium finishes at Brno from his 11 years racing in MotoGP; second in 2011 and 2019 and a win in 2018 from pole position.
- In 2016, he had to retire from the Czech GP after suffering severe tyre issues.
- In 2017, he crossed the line in sixth after changing bike on Lap 6 and dropping down to 15th.

5. Johann Zarco, Reale Avintia Racing – Age: 30 – Nationality: French

- In 125cc, Zarco secured a podium in 2011 when he finished second from second on the grid.
- In 2015, he won the Moto2[™] race from pole position.
- Zarco qualified on pole at Brno again in 2016 but finished 11th after dropping as low as 16th mid-race.
- In 2017, he qualified 10th and quickly fought for the lead on his first time riding a MotoGP[™] bike in Brno. He was the last rider of the field to swap onto his second bike for slick tyres.
- In 2018, he both qualified and finished in seventh place.
- Last year, he qualified in third place which was his first front row start on the KTM, and the best qualifying result for the Austrian manufacturer in MotoGP[™] at that time, later beaten by P. Espargaro, second in qualifying at Misano. He dropped down to 12th on the opening lap and eventually finished the race in 14th.

9. Danilo Petrucci, Ducati Team – Age: 29 – Nationality: Italian

- Petrucci finished second at Brno in the Superstock 600 European Championship race in 2009.
- He qualified 19th and finished 17th in MotoGP[™] in 2012, his rookie year in Grand Prix racing.
- In 2016 and 2017 Petrucci finished the race in seventh place and in 2018, he crossed the line in sixth, which is his best result at the track.
- Last year, he both qualified and finished in eighth place as the third Ducati rider.

12. Maverick Viñales, Monster Energy Yamaha MotoGP – Age: 25 – Nationality: Spanish

- Viñales has had two podiums from his nine Grand Prix appearances at Brno; second behind Luis Salom in Moto3[™] in 2013 and third in 2017 in MotoGP[™] as the top Yamaha rider.
- He has also had a pole at Brno, in Moto3[™] in 2012, when he finished the race in fourth.
- In 2014, he finished sixth in Moto2[™] after qualifying down in 17th place on the grid.
- 2015 was his first-time racing at Brno in MotoGP[™], he qualified seventh but crashed out of ninth on Lap 16.
- In 2016, Viñales qualified eighth and finished ninth.
- In 2018, he qualified in 12th and crashed out at Turn 3 in the opening lap following an incident with Smith and Bradl.
- Last year, he qualified ninth on slicks in tricky conditions. He finished 10th after dropping down to 15th on the opening lap (he started on the damp part of the grid).

20. Fabio Quartararo, Petronas Yamaha SRT – Age: 21 – Nationality: French

- Quartararo has competed in Brno for the last five years.
- He failed to score any points in Moto3[™], crashing then retiring in 2015 and finishing 21st in 2016.
- In 2017, he crossed the line in 20th in Moto2[™] and in 2018, he was 11th.
- 2019 was Quartararo's first race in Brno on a MotoGP[™] bike; he qualified in 10th equalling his worst qualifying so far in MotoGP[™] along with France last year. He finished the race in seventh, which is his best result across the line at Brno so far.

21. Franco Morbidelli, Petronas Yamaha SRT – Age: 25 – Nationality: Italian

- Morbidelli competed at Brno in the Moto2[™] class from 2014 to 2017.
- In 2017, he qualified in third and finished in eighth after the race was interrupted and shortened to six laps due to rain, equalling his best result at Brno from 2014 and 2016.
- Morbidelli raced at Brno for the first time on a MotoGP[™] bike in 2018, finishing in 13th place.
- Last year, he qualified in 12th after struggling with tyre choice in Q2 but crashed out on the opening lap after colliding with Zarco at Turn 4, taking out Mir in the process.

- Nakagami's best result at the Czech GP also came also in 2013 with a second, his only podium finish at this track.
- In 2017, he finished 24th after starting 15th, his worst result of the season.
- In 2018, he raced in Brno for the first time in MotoGP[™], he qualified in 19th and finished in 17th, avoiding the incident with Viñales, Smith and Bradl on the opening lap at Turn 3.
- Last year, he qualified in 13th and finished in ninth place as the third Honda rider.

33. Brad Binder, Red Bull KTM Factory Racing – Age: 24 – Nationality: South African

- From 2012 to 2016, Binder raced in the Moto3[™] class in Brno with a best result of third in 2015 and a pole position in 2016, when he crashed out at Turn 1 while leading the race with five laps remaining.
- Over the last three years, he has raced in Moto2[™] at Brno with a best result of sixth in 2018.
- Last year, Binder started from 16th, but crashed out of the race at Turn 11 on Lap 13 while sitting in ninth place.
- In 2020, Binder will be racing in Brno for the first time on a MotoGP[™] bike.

35. Cal Crutchlow, LCR Honda Castrol – Age: 34 – Nationality: British

- In 2011, Crutchlow qualified 11th, then crashed out of the race on Lap 7 at the exit of Turn 1.
- In 2012, he finished third at the Czech GP - his first MotoGP[™] podium finish.
- In 2013, he qualified on pole at Brno, then crashed out of fourth place on Lap 8 and restarted to finish 17th.
- In 2014, he retired from the race after running off into the gravel trap and in 2015 he crashed on the 15th lap.
- In 2016, Crutchlow took his first victory in MotoGP[™] after starting from 10th and ending the first lap in 15th. It was the first win in the class for a British rider since Barry Sheene in 1981.
- In 2017, he started from fifth and finished fifth after being passed by Rossi on the final lap.
- In 2018, he was also passed by Rossi on the last lap, crossing the line in fifth as the highest-placed Independent Team rider.
- Last year, he didn't change to slicks early enough and qualified in 11th, but made his way through the field to finish in fifth as the second Independent Team rider.

36. Joan Mir, Team Suzuki Ecstar – Age: 22 – Nationality: Spanish

- Mir won the Moto3[™] race in 2017 on his way to clinching the title.
- In 2018, he crashed out of the Moto2[™] race at Turn 5 on the opening lap in an incident involving Remy Gardner and Bo Bendsneyder.
- 2019 was Mir's first race in Brno on a MotoGP[™] bike; he qualified in 19th and knocked out by Morbidelli on the opening lap at Turn 4.
- Mir heavily crashed during the Official Test on Monday following the Czech GP. He missed the following two events in Austria and Silverstone.

38. Bradley Smith, Aprilia Racing Team Gresini – Age: 29 – Nationality: British

- Smith's best result at Brno is 4th in the 125cc class in 2009.
- In 2010, he qualified on pole for the 125cc race but chose the wrong setting for the mixed conditions and finished sixth.
- In 2015 at Brno, he scored his best finish at Brno in MotoGP[™] with seventh.
- In 2016, he suffered technical issues during the race; swapped onto his second bike set up with slick tyres, then eventually retired from the race.
- In 2017, he started from 19th and decided to switch bike on Lap 2. Then, he retired two laps before the end.
- In 2018, he started from 15th as the only KTM rider on the grid (P. Espargaro missed the race due to injury) but was knocked out by Bradl at Turn 3 on the opening lap and then he took out Viñales in the process.

41. Aleix Espargaro, Aprilia Racing Team Gresini – Age: 31 – Nationality: Spanish

- In 2010, Aleix Espargaro finished 12th in MotoGP[™], and in 2011 he finished sixth in the Moto2[™] race - his best result at the circuit.
- In 2013, he was the first CRT rider across the line in 10th place.
- In 2014 he was the first Open Class rider across the line in eighth and in 2015, he finished ninth.
- In 2016, he qualified fourth but retired with an engine problem.
- In 2017, he started 11th and finished eighth after being involved in an incident in the pitlane with Iannone.
- In 2018, he struggled at the beginning of the weekend following injuries sustained at the German GP. He made his way through the field from 23rd on the grid to finish 15th.
- Last year, he qualified in 18th, made an incredible start to move up to 11th on the opening lap, but then dropped back down to 18th after struggling with the rear.

42. Alex Rins, Team Suzuki Ecstar – Age: 24 – Nationality: Spanish

- Rins has finished on the podium twice in Moto2[™] at Brno: third in 2015 and second in 2017.
- Rins' best qualifying at Brno came in 2013 when he started the Moto3[™] race from pole.
- In 2017, he qualified 13th, which was his best qualifying result in the premier class at that time, and finished 11th.
- In 2018, he started from ninth, moved up to eighth and then dropped down to 11th after struggling with grip.
- In 2019, he qualified in sixth place and fought for third before being overtaken by Miller with two laps to go.

43. Jack Miller, Pramac Racing – Age: 25 – Nationality: Australian

- Miller finished seventh in Moto3[™] in his first appearance at Brno in 2013.
- In 2014, he was leading the Moto3[™] race into Turn 13 on the final lap but lost out on the sprint to the line and finished fifth, just 0.217 secs behind the race winner.
- In 2015, he qualified 22nd and finished the MotoGP[™] race in 19th.
- Miller did not compete at Brno in 2016 due to injury.
- In 2017, he finished 14th, losing time during his bike swap and suffering a lack of rear grip.
- In 2018, he qualified in 17th but made his way through the field to cross the line in 12th place.
- Last year, he qualified in second as the highest-placed Ducati and Independent Team rider using slicks on the wet track. He managed to pass Rins two laps before the end to cross the line in third place.

44. Pol Espargaro, Red Bull KTM Factory Racing – Age: 29 – Nationality: Spanish

- Pol Espargaro's first podium at Brno was second in the 125cc race in 2010.
- He was on pole in Moto2[™] in 2012; he finished the race in third just 0.44 seconds behind racer winner Marc Marquez.
- In 2014, he crashed out of the MotoGP[™] race on Lap 7 and in 2015 he qualified and finished the race in eighth.
- In 2017, Espargaro crossed the line in ninth, which was the first top 10 finish for KTM in the premier class.
- In 2018, he missed the race at Brno after he sustained a broken left collarbone during a crash in Warm Up.
- In 2019, he qualified in fifth place; with Zarco in second, which is the only time so far there were two KTM riders within the front two rows of the grid in the premier class. He stayed in fifth in the opening four laps before dropping down to 11th.

46. Valentino Rossi, Monster Energy Yamaha MotoGP – Age: 41 – Nationality: Italian

- Rossi scored his very first win in GP racing at Brno in 1996 in the 125cc class, after starting from pole for the first time in his GP career; he also won the 250cc Czech GP in 1999.
- From his 20 starts in the premier class at Brno, Rossi has had 11 podium finishes, including five wins, the last of which was in 2009.
- In 2014 and 2015, Rossi finished in third place.
- In 2016, he finished second after having been down in 12th in the early laps.
- In 2017, he fought for the lead at the early stage of the race, swapped onto his second bike on Lap 6 and dropped to 14th. He eventually finished fourth after battling with Crutchlow on the final lap.
- In 2018, he also finished in fourth place after fighting with Crutchlow on the final lap.
- Last year, he qualified in seventh and finished the race in sixth place, both as the highest-placed Yamaha rider.
- Rossi has started from pole on three occasions at Brno in MotoGP: 2003, 2006 and 2009.

6. Stefan Bradl, Repsol Honda Team – Age: 30 – Nationality: German

- Bradl finished on the podium twice at Brno when racing in the smaller classes; his maiden GP win came in the 125cc race in 2008 and a third place in the Moto2 race in 2011.
- His best result in the MotoGP class at Brno is fifth in his rookie season of 2012.
- In 2018, he crashed out on the opening lap at Turn 3 with Viñales and Smith.
- In 2019, he replaced injured Jorge Lorenzo in Repsol Honda Team; he qualified in 17th and managed to score one point, finishing 15th.
- In 2020, he will replace the injured Marc Marquez at Brno in the Repsol Honda Team.
