4. Andrea Dovizioso, Ducati Team – Age: 34 – Nationality: Italian

-In 2016 at the Austrian GP, Dovizioso reached the milestone of 250 Grand Prix starts. He qualified third at the Red Bull Ring, one of only three front row starts of that year, and finished the race second, losing out to then-teammate Andrea Iannone by less than a second.

-In 2017, he started from second and won the race after a close battle with Marc Marquez to the last corner.

-In 2018, he qualified second, didn't manage to pass Jorge Lorenzo and crossed the line third.

-Last year, he also qualified in second and won the race after last-lap battle, again with Marquez. He passed Marquez at the last corner and set the fastest lap of the race.

5. Johann Zarco, Esponsorama Racing – Age: 30 – Nationality: French

-In 2016, Zarco qualified on pole, won the Moto2[™] race and also set the fastest lap.

-2017 was the first time Zarco raced at the Red Bull Ring in the MotoGP[™] class. He crossed the line in fifth as the highest-placed Yamaha and Independent Team rider.

-In 2018, he started from sixth and dropped down to 11th in the early stages of the race, then moved up to ninth after battling with Rabat and Bautista.

-Last year, he qualified in 16th, worked his way through the field to finish 12th. On Monday after the Austrian GP, he announced his split with KTM for the 2020 season.

9. Danilo Petrucci, Ducati Team – Age: 29 – Nationality: Italian

-In 2016, Petrucci qualified 13th and was in 12th into the final corner when he collided with Laverty, moving up to finish 11th. He was subsequently given a grid penalty at the following race in Brno for the move.

-In 2017, he qualified in fifth place, but had to retire on Lap 7 after dropping down to 22nd.

-In 2018, he started from fourth on the grid as the highest-placed Independent Team rider and crossed the line in fifth place behind Crutchlow.

-Last year, he qualified in 12th after crashing at Turn 4 in Q2. He eventually finished the race in ninth, which was his worst result at that time of the 2019 season.

12. Maverick Viñales, Monster Energy Yamaha MotoGP – Age: 25 – Nationality: Spanish

-In 2016, Viñales qualified sixth and finished the race in the same place

-In 2017, he started from fourth and struggled with the rear grip, crossing the line sixth behind Zarco.

-In 2018, he was 11th on the grid after suffering electronics problems. He dropped down to 16th by Lap 2 but managed to cross the line in 12th.

-Last year, he started from fourth, fought with Miller at Turn 3 and dropped down to seventh. He finished the race in fifth place after fighting with Rossi for fourth.

20. Fabio Quartararo, Petronas Yamaha SRT – Age: 21 – Nationality: French

-In 2016, Quartararo crossed the line in fourth place in the Moto3[™] race in Austria, which was his best result of that season, later equalled in Malaysia.

-In 2017 and 2018, he raced at the Red Bull Ring in Moto2[™] with a best result of ninth in 2018 after qualifying third.

-2019 was Quartararo's first year competing in MotoGP[™] in Austria; he qualified in second equalling Yamaha's best qualifying at the Red Bull Ring achieved by Valentino Rossi, who was the second-fastest qualifier back in 2016. He led the opening five laps before eventually finishing the race in third, equalling Yamaha's best result at the track achieved by Lorenzo in 2016.

-In 2018, he raced in Austria for the first time on a MotoGP[™] bike. He qualified in 16th place but got a three-position penalty and started from 19th, eventually finishing the race in 19th.

-Last year, he qualified in 14th, worked his way through the field and crossed the line in 10th as the fourth Yamaha rider.

-In 2016, Mir qualified on pole position in Moto3⁺ for the first time in his Grand Prix career at the Red Bull Ring, on his way to winning his first Grand Prix.
-In 2017, he again won the Austrian GP after qualifying 10th. It was his seventh win of the season on his way to clinching the Moto3⁺ title.
-In 2018, he qualified down in 20th in Moto2⁺ and made his way through the field to cross the line in eighth.
-Last year, he missed his first MotoGP⁺ race at the track due to injuries sustained at the Brno Test.
-2020 will be Mir's first time on a MotoGP⁺ bike at the Red Bull Ring.

-In 2017, he started from 20th on the grid and managed to move up to 13th despite struggling with low speed acceleration.
-In 2018, he was 15th on the grid and made a great start to move up to eighth on Lap 3 before dropping down to 17th, lacking rear grip.
-Last year, he qualified in 19th, but dropped down to 21st after contact at Turn 3 on the opening lap. He worked his way through the field to finish 14th.

-In 2016, Rins qualified ninth in Moto2⁺ and finished third, his fifth podium in the opening ten races of the season.
-2017 was the first year he raced in Austria on a MotoGP⁺ machine; he started from 21st and finished the race in 16th after running off the track following contact with another rider.
-In 2018, he qualified in 10th place and crossed the line in eighth as the highest-placed Suzuki rider after moving up to fifth on the opening lap.
-Last year, he was the only Suzuki rider in the field; he qualified in seventh, moved up to third on the opening lap of the race, before eventually finishing in sixth place right behind Viñales

-In 2016, Pol Espargaro qualified 15th, his equal lowest position of that year, and finished in 10th place but kept hold of his lead as top Independent Team rider.
-In 2017, he started from 24th on the grid and he retired from the race on Lap 3 with a rear brake sensor problem.
-In 2018, Espargaro missed the Austrian GP after fracturing his collarbone in the morning Warm Up at Brno the week before.
-Last year, he qualified in 11th, which is the best qualifying result for a KTM rider at the Red Bull Ring in the MotoGP⁺ class to date, but had to retire from the race on Lap 2 due to a technical problem.

46. Valentino Rossi, Monster Energy Yamaha MotoGP – Age: 41 – Nationality: Italian

- In 2016, Rossi was the highest-placed Yamaha qualifying, in second place on the grid
- He led over the line on the first lap but ran wide and dropped back to fifth; then able to fight his way past Marquez and finish in fourth.
- In 2017, he started from seventh, moved up to fourth and then dropped back to seventh after running off the track at Turn 1 with 15 laps remaining.
- In 2018, he missed Q2 for the first time since the 2017 Catalan GP and started from 14th on the grid. He made his way through the field and managed to finish sixth as the highest-placed Yamaha rider.
- Last year, he qualified in 10th place, and finished in fourth place behind Quartararo.
- The Red Bull Ring is only the second circuit on the 2020 Grand Prix calendar, along with new track Portimão, where Rossi has not had a podium finish in the premier class.

- In 2017, he started from 24th on the grid and crossed the line in 19th, which is his lowest position across the line since (along with Qatar in 2019).
- In 2018, he qualified seventh, which is the most recent time he has qualified on the front three rows of the grid. He suffered rear grip issues during the race and crossed the line 11th.

- Marquez has had two podiums in Moto2[™] at the Austrian GP, in 2017 and 2019, both second places.
- In 2017, he qualified in third place, his best qualifying result at the track, and finished the race in second after fighting with Lüthi who ran off the track at Turn 1 with three laps to go.
- In 2018, he qualified in fifth place in Moto2[™] and crashed out of the race at the last corner trying to overtake Marini for the third place.
- Last year, he qualified in 11th place in Moto2[™], which was his worst qualifying performance so at that stage of the season; he eventually finished the race in second after colliding with Gardner with six laps remaining.
- In 2020, Marquez will be racing at the Austrian GP for the first time on a MotoGP[™] bike.
