### 4. Andrea Dovizioso, Ducati Team – Age: 34 – Nationality: Italian

-Dovizioso had four successive podium finishes at the Catalan GP in the smaller classes, from 2004 to 2007, including a 250cc win in 2006 from pole and a win in 2017 on what was his tenth start in MotoGP\* at the track.  
 -Prior to that win, he had had a single podium in Catalunya in the premier class – third in 2012 on the Tech 3 Yamaha.  
 -In 2014, he was the first Ducati rider across the line in eighth.  
 -In 2015, he crashed out of third place on the sixth lap.  
 -In 2016, he was again the first Ducati across the line in seventh position.  
 -In 2018, he qualified third, his first front row of 2018, but crashed out at Turn 5 while sitting in third.  
 -Last year, he started fifth and led on Lap 1 before being knocked out by Lorenzo on Lap 2 with Viñales and Rossi.

### 9. Danilo Petrucci, Ducati Team – Age: 29 – Nationality: Italian

-Petrucci raced at Catalunya for the first time in 2012: he qualified in 20th and finished 19<sup>th</sup>.  
 -In 2013, he finished 11<sup>th</sup>, his best result of 2013.  
 -In 2014 he did not race as he had still not fully recovered from injuries suffered at Jerez.  
 -In 2015, he qualified in 16th but improved during the race to finish in ninth place.  
 -In 2016, he again finished in ninth position after fighting with Dovizioso towards the end of the race to be top Ducati.  
 -In 2017, Petrucci started from third, which was the first front row start of his Grand Prix career. He crashed out of the race two laps before the end at Turn 5.  
 -In 2018, he finished the race in ninth place after battling with Dani Pedrosa.  
 -Last year, he qualified seventh and finished third as top Ducati. It was his third podium in a row and his most recent.

### 20. Fabio Quartararo, Petronas Yamaha SRT – Age: 21 – Nationality: French

-Quartararo qualified on pole position in Moto2\* in 2018. Aged 19 years 57 days old, he became the second youngest rider to qualify on pole position in Moto2\* behind Marc Marquez (18 years 114 days old).  
 -Quartararo went on to win in Moto2\* in 2018, becoming the sixth-youngest rider to win in the intermediate category, behind Marco Melandri.  
 -2019 was Quartararo's first race in Barcelona on a MotoGP\* bike; he qualified on pole for the second time in the class and went on to finish second for his first podium in MotoGP\*.

### 27. Iker Lecuona, Red Bull KTM Tech 3 – Age: 20 – Nationality: Spanish

-Lecuona competed in Catalunya in Moto2\* over the last three years with a best result of 10th in 2017.  
 -2020 will be Lecuona's first year competing in MotoGP\* in Barcelona.

### 5. Johann Zarco, Esponsorama Racing – Age: 30 – Nationality: French

-Zarco has raced for the last 11 years at Catalunya and won the Moto2\* race in 2015 and 2016, both from pole.  
 -His only other podium at the circuit was in 2014, when he was third in Moto2\*.  
 -In 2017, he qualified in 14<sup>th</sup> position and crossed the line in fifth as the first Yamaha rider after battling with his teammate Folger, who set the fastest lap of the race.  
 -In 2018, he crossed the line in seventh place from eighth on the grid.  
 -Last year, he qualified 18<sup>th</sup>, made his way through the field to finish the race in 10<sup>th</sup> as the second KTM rider.

### 12. Maverick Viñales, Monster Energy Yamaha MotoGP – Age: 25 – Nationality: Spanish

-Viñales has finished on the podium in four out of nine GP starts at the Catalan GP.  
 -He was second in 125cc in 2011, won the Moto3\* race in 2012 from pole and was third in Moto3\* in 2013 on his way to taking the title.  
 -In 2014, he finished second in Moto2\* in Catalunya.  
 -In 2015, he qualified second and finished the race in sixth place, his equal best result of his rookie MotoGP\* season.  
 -In 2016, he finished the race in fourth from sixth on the grid, also setting the fastest lap of the race.  
 -In 2017, Viñales failed to qualify within the first two rows for the first time that season. He crossed the line in 10th place after dropping down to 16th after the start; that was his worst result across the line at that time with Yamaha.  
 -In 2018, he crossed the line in sixth place after qualifying in fourth as the highest-placed Yamaha rider on the grid.  
 -Last year, he qualified third, but was given a penalty of 3 grid positions after having impeded Quartararo at the end of Q2. He started sixth but was knocked out at Turn 10 on Lap 2 by Lorenzo along with Rossi and Dovizioso.

### 21. Franco Morbidelli, Petronas Yamaha SRT – Age: 25 – Nationality: Italian

-Morbidelli competed at Catalunya in Moto2\* from 2014 to 2017.  
 -His best result at this track is a fifth-place finish in 2017 from sixth on the grid after a great battle with Pasini in the early stages of the race.  
 -2018 was Morbidelli's first time racing at Barcelona on a MotoGP\* bike; he crossed the line in 14th after crashing and remounting to score two points.  
 -Last year, he crashed heavily in FP3 but managed to qualify in fourth after passing through Q1. He started from third due to Viñales penalty but crashed out on Lap 16 at Turn 7 while sitting in ninth.

-Nakagami competed at Catalunya in Moto2\* from 2012 to 2017 and finished on the podium in 2015, in third.  
 -He also raced in Barcelona in 125cc back in 2008 and 2009.  
 -In 2018, Nakagami competed for the first time in MotoGP\* at Catalunya; he joined Q2 for the first time to qualify in 12th place but crashed out of the race on Lap 14.  
 -Last year, he qualified in 16th, but worked his way through the field to finish the race in eighth as second Honda.

- Over the last three years, he raced in Moto2™ at Barcelona with a best result of sixth in 2018.
- Last year, Binder qualified in 19th, equalling his worst qualifying result of the season from Italy; but he was already in 10th place on the opening lap and finished the race in 11th place.
- In 2020, Binder will be racing in Barcelona for the first time on a MotoGP™ bike.

### 36. Joan Mir, Team Suzuki Ecstar – Age: 23 – Nationality: Spanish

- In 2017, Mir won in Moto3™ from fourth on the grid, which was his fourth win of that season.
- In 2018, Mir qualified in eighth and crashed out of the Moto2™ race on Lap 13 while sitting in ninth place.
- 2019 was Mir's first race in Catalunya on a MotoGP™ bike; he qualified in 11th and finished the race in sixth, which was his best result across the line at that time in his rookie season.

### 41. Aleix Espargaro, Aprilia Racing Team Gresini – Age: 31 – Nationality: Spanish

- Aleix Espargaro finished third in Moto2™ at the 2011 Catalan GP, his first podium finish in GP racing.
- In 2014, he was the first Open Class rider in sixth place, his best result at Catalunya in the premier class.
- In 2015, he qualified on pole position, giving Suzuki their first pole in eight years, but then in the race he crashed out of fourth place on the 21st lap.
- In 2016, he retired from the race after suffering with technical problems.
- In 2017, he qualified in fifth place on the grid, equalling the best qualifying result in the MotoGP™ era by an Aprilia rider at that time, then retired with a technical problem.
- In 2018, he qualified in 16th place, but got a three-position grid penalty for riding slowly during the warm-up. He crashed out of the race on Lap 5.
- Last year, he retired from the race after a collision with Aprilia test rider Smith on Lap 1 that damaged his left knee.

### 43. Jack Miller, Pramac Racing – Age: 25 – Nationality: Australian

- In 2014, Miller finished fourth in Moto3™ after making up four places on the final lap.
- In 2015, he qualified in 21st and finished the race in 11th, the best result of his rookie season in MotoGP™.
- In 2016, Miller finished in tenth place; the first top ten finish in his MotoGP™ career and the first points he had scored since the opening round in Qatar.
- In 2017, he qualified 15th then crashed out of the race at Turn 5 on Lap 14.
- In 2018, he made his way through the field from 13th on the grid before eventually retiring from the race on Lap 18 while sitting in tenth place.
- Last year, he missed Q2 after crashing in Q1 and started from 14th on the grid; he was already in second place on Lap 2 and eventually finished the race in fifth place between Rins and Mir, as the second Ducati rider.

### 35. Cal Crutchlow, LCR Honda Castrol – Age: 34 – Nationality: British

- Crutchlow raced at Catalunya for the first time in 2011, when he finished seventh as the first non-factory bike, and in 2012 he finished fifth after battling with Stoner for much of the race.
- In 2013, he qualified in second place, then crashed out of the race on the sixth lap.
- He qualified 13th in 2014, then retired from the race on the tenth lap with technical problems.
- In 2015, he failed to finish for the third consecutive year at Catalunya after he was pushed wide by Aleix Espargaro and crashed on the first lap.
- In 2016, he qualified in seventh and finished in sixth place, his first top six of 2016.
- In 2017, he qualified in 17th after crashing in Q1; he made his way through the field to finish the race in 11th place.
- In 2018, he qualified in tenth place and finished the race in fourth, which is his best result in Catalunya so far.
- Last year, he started from ninth on the grid, dropped down to 12th on the opening lap before moving up to fifth. He then crashed out trying to overtake Miller at Turn 4 with six laps to go.

### 38. Bradley Smith, Aprilia Racing Team Gresini – Age: 29 – Nationality: British

- Smith has had a single podium finish at the Catalan GP; second in the 125cc race in 2010.
- In 2013, he was sixth, equalling his best result of his rookie season in MotoGP™.
- In 2017, he got a good start from eighth position on the grid and finished the race in fifth.
- In 2016, he qualified in 14th and then had to retire during the race with a transmission issue.
- In 2017, he missed the race following a crash at Turn 2 during FP4, injuring his finger.
- In 2018, he started 16th and was eighth on the opening lap before dropping to 16th and being knocked out by Nakagami on Lap 14.
- Last year, he was a wildcard for Aprilia. He crashed out on the opening lap at Turn 10.

### 42. Alex Rins, Team Suzuki Ecstar – Age: 24 – Nationality: Spanish

- Rins has finished on the podium three times at Catalunya, in Moto3™ – second in 2013 – and in Moto2™ – second in both 2015 and in 2016.
- 2018 was the first time that Rins competed in MotoGP™ at Montmelo as he missed the race in 2017 due to a left wrist injury sustained at Austin; he qualified in 15th place but crashed out of the race on Lap 12 while sitting 20th.
- Last year, he qualified in ninth after crashing on his last flying lap in Q2. He fought for the second place throughout the race but nearly crashed at Turn 1 with seven laps to go trying to overtake Petrucci. He dropped down to seventh but eventually finished the race in fourth.

### 44. Pol Espargaro, Red Bull KTM Factory Racing – Age: 29 – Nationality: Spanish

- Pol Espargaro made his GP debut in 125cc at the Catalan GP in 2006 just eight days after his 15th birthday.
- He has had two 125cc podiums: second in 2008, after qualifying on pole for the first time, and third in 2010.
- In 2013, he qualified on pole for the Moto2™ race and won for the first time at the circuit.
- He finished seventh in his rookie MotoGP™ season, and in 2015 he crashed out of the race on the fifth lap at Turn 3.
- In 2016, he finished the race in fifth as the top Independent rider for the fourth time in the first seven races of 2016.
- In 2017, he started from 20th on the grid and crossed the line in 18th.
- In 2018, he started from 18th following a penalty for his brother Aleix and made his way through the field to cross the line in 11th place for the fifth time since the opening race in Qatar.
- Last year, he qualified 12th and finished the race seventh, which is KTM's best result at the track so far in MotoGP™.

### 46. Valentino Rossi, Monster Energy Yamaha MotoGP – Age: 41 – Nationality: Italian

-Prior to 2010, Rossi had finished on the podium for thirteen successive years in Catalunya, a sequence starting when he won the 125cc race there in 1997.  
 -In the premier class, he has had 14 podium finishes in Catalunya, including seven victories, and has started from pole there on four occasions.  
 -In addition to the seven premier class wins, he also won the 125cc in 1997 and the 250cc race in 1998 and 1999.  
 -Rossi finished second at the Catalan GP in both 2014 and 2015.  
 -In 2016, Rossi qualified in fifth, got a poor start and dropped down to eighth early in the first lap, fought back to win the race – his first win at the circuit for seven years.  
 -In 2017, he qualified in 13th place on the grid, which was his worst qualifying result in dry conditions since he was 17th at Valencia 2007, then finished the race in eighth place.  
 -In 2018, he qualified in seventh place and made his way through the field to cross the line in third place as the highest-placed Yamaha rider.  
 -Last year, he qualified in fifth place but started from fourth following Viñales grid penalty; he crashed on Lap 2 trying to avoid Lorenzo's bike while overtaking Petrucci for fifth place.

### 88. Miguel Oliveira, Red Bull KTM Tech 3 – Age: 25 – Nationality: Portuguese

-Oliveira has had three podium finishes at the Catalan GP; a third place in back in 2012 – the first of his GP career – a third place in 2017 and a second last year, both in Moto2\*.  
 -On his nine visits in Barcelona, Oliveira failed to score points only once, when he crashed out of the 125cc race in 2011 on the opening lap.  
 -In 2019, Oliveira raced in Catalunya for the first time on a MotoGP\* bike; he qualified in 20th, made his way through the field to cross the line in 12th place.

### 53. Tito Rabat, Esponsorama Racing – Age: 31 – Nationality: Spanish

-Rabat finished on the podium at Catalunya in Moto2\* for three consecutive years between 2013–2015, including a win in 2014 from pole position.  
 -In 2016, Rabat rode despite having broken his collarbone 15 days beforehand in Italy; picking up points, he finished in 14th place.  
 -In 2017, he headed the seventh row on the grid then scored one point, finishing in 15th.  
 -In 2018, he qualified in ninth place, which was his best dry weather qualifying result in MotoGP\* at that time, then he retired while sitting in ninth.  
 -Last year, he qualified in 19th, worked his way through the field to finish in ninth place, which was his best result in MotoGP\* at the track and his most recent top ten finish.

### 6. Stefan Bradl, Repsol Honda Team – Age: 30 – Nationality: German

-Bradl made his Grand Prix debut, at the age of fifteen, in the 125cc class as a wildcard at the Catalan GP in 2005.  
 -In 2011, he qualified on pole and won the Moto2\* race at the Catalan GP - his only podium finish at the circuit.
