4. Andrea Dovizioso, Ducati Team – Age: 34 – Nationality: Italian

- In 2010, Dovizioso crashed at Turn 13 on the last lap while battling with Spies for fifth.
- His races at Aragón in both 2011 and 2014 also ended in crashes
- He had his first podium finish at the track in 2012, in third place after getting the better of teammate Crutchlow after a race-long battle.
- In 2016, he qualified in fourth place but struggled during the race and finished in 11th.
- In 2017, he both started and finished the race in seventh after moving up to third in the early stages of the race.
- In 2018, he qualified in second place and fought with Marquez for the win before eventually finishing in second.
- Last year, he qualified 10th, but made his way through the field to finish the race in second after overtaking Viñales on the back straight with three laps to go.

5. Johann Zarco, Esponsorama Racing – Age: 30 – Nationality: French

- Before 2019, Zarco has raced at Aragón for nine years, with a best result of second in the 125cc class in 2011.
- He has also finished on the podium once in Moto2[™] in 2014, when he was third from second on the grid.
- He has started the Moto2[™] race from the front row twice, but never from pole.
- 2017 was Zarco's first year racing at Aragón in MotoGP[™]; he qualified 11th after passing through Q1 and crossed the line in ninth.
- In 2018, he missed Q2 from Q1, qualified in 14th place but started from 12th. He crossed the line in 14th.
- Last year, he left before the race and was replaced by Kallio for the remainder of 2019 season at Red Bull KTM Factory Racing.

9. Danilo Petrucci, Ducati Team – Age: 29 – Nationality: Italian

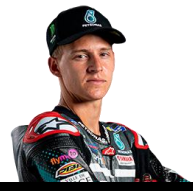
- Petrucci qualified on pole and finished third in the FIM Superstock 1000 Cupat Aragón in 2011.
- He finished 17th in 2012 in his rookie season in MotoGP[™].
- In 2013, he crashed out on the first lap, and in 2014, he finished 11th, his best result of that year.
- In 2017, he crashed out on Lap 10, one of only two occasions that year that he didn't score points.
- In 2016, he qualified ninth, was given a ride through penalty for knocking Redding off in the race and finished 17th.
- In 2017, Petrucci qualified 16th and finished 20th after having rear tyre problems for his worst result across the line at the time.
- In 2018, he both qualified and finished in seventh.
- Last year, he qualified 15th, which was his second-worst qualifying 2019 (after Misano) but started from 14th. He eventually crossed the line in 12th after fighting for ninth during the race.

12. Maverick Viñales, Monster Energy Yamaha MotoGP – Age: 25 – Nationality: Spanish

- Viñales finished on the podium in each of his three starts at Aragón in the lower classes: third in the 125cc race in 2011, second in Moto3[™] in 2013 and a win in Moto2[™] in 2014 from pole.
- He missed the Moto3[™] race in 2012 when the bike suffered a technical failure on the Warm Up lap.
- In 2015, he qualified for the MotoGP[™] race in 12th and finished 11th.
- In 2016, he qualified second and led for part of the race, but ultimately finished in fourth.
- In 2017, he qualified on pole for the fifth time in 2017 and for the second successive race; this was also his first pole at a Spanish circuit since Moto2[™] in Aragón in 2014. He finished the race fourth as the highest-placed Yamaha.
- In 2018, he was given a grid penalty and started from 14th, but crossed the line in 10th place.
- Last year, he started from third on the grid, fought for the podium with Quartararo in the early stages of the race before dropping down to fourth after being overtaken by Dovizioso and Miller.

20. Fabio Quartararo, Petronas Yamaha SRT – Age: 21 – Nationality: French

- In 2014, Quartararo won the CEV Moto3[™] race in Aragón, his third win of the season on his way to clinching his second title in the class.
- In 2015, he missed the Moto3[™] race due to an ankle injury sustained at Misano.
- In 2016, he qualified sixth and finished the Moto3[™] race in 12th.
- In 2017, he qualified in 14th for the Moto2[™] race and crossed the line in 11th place.
- In 2018, he qualified in seventh place and finished the Moto2[™] race in ninth place.
- 2019 was Quartararo's first race in Aragón on a MotoGP[™] bike; he just missed pole on his last flying lap but started from the front row for the eighth time of his rookie season. He fought with Viñales in the early stages of the race and then dropped down to eventually finish fifth, his best result at the track.

21. Franco Morbidelli, Petronas Yamaha SRT – Age: 25 – Nationality: Italian

- Morbidelli competed three times at Aragón in Moto2[™] and finished on the podium in 2016 and 2017.
- He missed the Moto2[™] race in 2015 due to a leg injury sustained whilst training motocross.
- In 2016, he finished third from eighth on the grid.
- In 2017, he won the Moto2[™] race from fourth on the grid after battling with Pasini until the final lap.
- 2018 was Morbidelli's first time racing in MotoGP[™] at Aragón; he qualified in 13th but had a grid penalty and started from 19th. He worked his way through the field to finish the race in 11th.
- Last year, he qualified ninth after going through Q1, but he was crashed out at Turn 12 on the opening lap by Rins.

- Lecuona competed in Aragón in Moto2[™] over the last three years with a best result of seventh last year from 10th on the grid.
- 2020 will be Lecuona's first race in Aragón on a MotoGP[™] bike.

- His best result at the track is fifth in 2016 from third on the grid, which is also his best qualifying result at this track.
- In 2017, he finished the Moto2[™] race in eighth from 10th on the grid.
- He raced at Aragón in 2018 for the first time on a MotoGP[™] bike; he joined Q2 for the third time in his rookie season, started 11th and finished 12th, equalling his best result in the class at that time.
- Last year, he qualified 14th but started 13th, struggled at the start and ran off the track trying to overtake Petrucci. He then made way through to finish the race in 10th.

35. Cal Crutchlow, LCR Honda Castrol – Age: 34 – Nationality: British

- Crutchlow raced at Aragón for the first time in 2011: he qualified 12th and finished ninth.
- Just lost out in a podium battle with teammate Dovizioso in 2012 and ended the race in fourth place.
- He finished sixth in 2013 and in 2014 he finished third, his only podium finish for Ducati.
- In both 2015 and 2016, he was the first Independent Team rider across the line; seventh in 2015 and fifth in 2016.
- In 2017, he qualified fourth as top Independent Team rider for the fifth time in 2017 but crashed out six laps before the end at Turn 14 after struggling with his brake lever in the early stages of the race.
- In 2018, he qualified fourth as top Independent and was behind Lorenzo when he crashed at Turn 1 on the opening lap. Crutchlow dropped to eighth and tried to move through the field before crashing at the same corner on Lap 5.
- Last year, he qualified seventh and finished sixth as the second Honda rider despite a run off during the race.

36. Joan Mir, Team Suzuki Ecstar – Age: 23 – Nationality: Spanish

- In 2015, Mir won the two Moto3™ Junior World Championship races held at MotorLand.
- In 2016, he qualified 24th place for the Moto3™ race and made his way through to cross the line in fifth.
- Mir won the Moto3™ race in Aragón in 2017 from sixth on the grid, on his way to clinching the title.
- In 2018 in Moto2™, he qualified 15th and finished sixth.
- 2019 was Mir's first race in Aragón on a MotoGP™ bike; he qualified ninth (outqualifying teammate Rins for the second time at that time, along with Le Mans); he dropped to 21st after four laps but made his way through to 14th.

38. Bradley Smith, Aprilia Racing Team Gresini – Age: 29 – Nationality: British

- Smith finished third in the 125cc race at Aragón in 2010, his only podium at this circuit.
- In 2011, he was sixth in Moto2™ after finishing the first lap down in 16th place, and in 2012 he was fifth.
- He finished seventh in 2013 in his rookie season in MotoGP™ and in 2014 he finished fifth despite running wide on the first lap and dropping down to 20th.
- In 2015, Smith qualified 10th and finished eighth.
- Smith did not race at Aragón in 2016, as he was still recovering from a knee injury and subsequent operation.
- In 2017, he qualified 23rd and finished 19th; in 2018 he qualified 16th and finished 13th as the sole KTM to finish.
- Last year, he was a wildcard for Aprilia; he started from 22nd and finished 19th.

41. Aleix Espargaro, Aprilia Racing Team Gresini – Age: 31 – Nationality: Spanish

- Aleix Espargaro finished 10th in MotoGP™ at Aragón in 2010 as the first of the satellite Ducati riders.
- He was 10th in 2012 and 11th in 2013, the first CRT rider across the line on both occasions.
- In 2014, riding the Forward Yamaha, he finished second, currently his only podium finish in MotoGP™.
- In 2015, he finished sixth, which was his best result of 2015.
- In 2016, he qualified eighth and finished seventh.
- In 2017, he also qualified eighth but finished sixth, equalling the best result for Aprilia in MotoGP™ (since 2002).
- In 2018, he started 13th, moved up to sixth on the opening lap and finished there as first Independent Team rider, equalling Aprilia's best result in MotoGP™ once again.
- Last year, he qualified fifth, which was the best qualifying for an Aprilia rider since he was the fourth-fastest qualifier in Japan back in 2017, and he finished the race seventh.

42. Alex Rins, Team Suzuki Ecstar – Age: 24 – Nationality: Spanish

- Rins has competed at Aragón for the last eight years, with a best result of a win in 2013 in Moto3™.
- He has qualified on pole position twice for the Moto3™ race, in 2013 and 2014.
- His best result in Moto2™ was in 2016 when he finished second from second on the grid.
- 2017 was the first year Rins raced at Aragón in MotoGP™; he qualified 20th and finished 17th.
- In 2018, he qualified ninth as the second Suzuki and finished fourth after battling teammate Iannone for the podium.
- Last year, he qualified 13th but started from 12th after Q2 graduate Pol Espargaro broke his wrist in FP4. He was handed long lap penalty in the race for irresponsible riding after a collision with Morbidelli at Turn 12 on the opening lap. He eventually finished the race in ninth despite a broken winglet following the collision.

43. Jack Miller, Pramac Racing – Age: 25 – Nationality: Australian

- Miller finished 13th in the Moto3™ race at Aragón in 2012.
- In 2013, he crashed out of the Moto3™ race after a clash with Alex Marquez while battling for the lead on the fourth lap; he restarted to finish 27th.
- 2015 was Miller's first-time racing in MotoGP™ at Aragón; he qualified 20th and finished 19th.
- He did not race at the track in 2016 as he was recovering from a crash in Austria.
- In 2017, he qualified and finished the race in 13th, which was the first time he scored points in MotoGP™ in Aragón.
- In 2019, he qualified 10th, was on the line where Lorenzo crashed at the first corner and dropped down to 11th on the opening lap. He eventually finished ninth.
- Last year, he qualified fourth as the top Ducati rider and crossed the line third behind Dovizioso after overtaking Viñales on the final lap. That was the third of his five podiums in 2019.

44. Pol Espargaro, Red Bull KTM Factory Racing – Age: 29 – Nationality: Spanish

- Espargaro has won at Aragón in both of the smaller classes; the 125cc race in 2010 and the Moto2™ race in 2012.
- In 2013, he finished third in Moto2™, just in front of his Championship rival Redding after a great battle over the final few laps.
- In 2014, he finished sixth, two tenths behind teammate Bradley Smith.
- In 2015, he qualified in fourth position which equalled his best qualifying of the season — he finished ninth.
- In 2016, he suffered a couple of heavy crashes in practice, started from 11th and finished eighth.
- In 2017, he qualified 14th and finished 10th ahead of teammate Kallio, for his second KTM top 10 finish of the year.
- In 2018, he crashed in FP3, broke his left collarbone he'd already fractured earlier at Brno, and missed the race.
- In 2019, he heavily crashed at Turn 9 in FP4, broke his left radius and had to miss the race again.

46. Valentino Rossi, Monster Energy Yamaha MotoGP – Age: 41 – Nationality: Italian

- Rossi finished sixth at Aragon in 2010, and 10th in 2011 after starting from the pit lane for exceeding his engine allowance.
- In 2012, he ran off the track on the first lap and dropped to the back of the field, recovering to finish eighth.
- In 2013 he had his first podium at Aragon finishing third, but in 2014 he crashed out on the fourth lap.
- In both 2015 and 2016, Rossi qualified sixth and finished third.
- In 2017, he came back after breaking his right tibia and fibia following an enduro training accident and missing the San Marino GP; he qualified third and managed to finish the race in fifth - just behind teammate Maverick Viñales.
- In 2018, he qualified 18th, equalling his worst qualifying result in dry conditions in the premier class at that time along with the Dutch TT in 2006 when he was injured, although he started from 17th due to a grid penalty for another rider. He made his way through the field to cross the line in eighth as the top Yamaha rider.
- Last year, he qualified in sixth and finished eighth after struggling with rear grip during the race.

- Last year, he started from 17th and finished again in 15th.

- Bagnaia has finished on the podium once at the Aragon GP; in 2018 from fifth on the grid after battling with Brad Binder.
- 2019 was Bagnaia's first race in Aragon on a MotoGP[™] bike; he started 15th and finished outside the points in 16th.

73. Alex Marquez, Repsol Honda Team – Age: 24 – Nationality: Spanish

- Marquez has had three podiums in the smaller classes in Aragon: second in Moto3[™] in 2014 and in Moto2[™] in 2016, and third last year from pole position.
- In 2014, on his way to clinching the title, he fought for the win before colliding with Miller in the last corner with 17 laps to go, causing Miller to crash. He eventually finished second after being overtaken by Fenati on the final lap.
- In 2016, he finished second in Moto2[™] after a last lap duel with teammate Morbidelli; that was his first podium in the class.
- Last year, he qualified on pole in Moto2[™] and finished third on his way to clinching his second world title.
- In 2020, Marquez will be racing at the Aragon GP for the first time on a MotoGP[™] bike.

6. Stefan Bradl, Repsol Honda Team – Age: 30 – Nationality: German

- Bradl finished ninth in Moto2[™] at Aragon in 2010 and 8th in 2011 after leading the race in the early laps.
- In 2012, he crashed at Turn 3 on the fifth lap when running in third.
- In 2013, he finished fifth, but just a second behind Rossi who took the final podium position.

- In 2015, Bradl finished in 18th despite a good start.
