## 4. Andrea Dovizioso, Ducati Team – Age: 34 – Nationality: Italian

- Dovizioso has finished on the podium nine times at Le Mans throughout his GP career, including a victory in the 125cc class on the way to winning the world title in 2004.
- In 2015, he finished third to add to his other podium finishes in MotoGP\* at Le Mans, third in 2010, second in 2011 and 2019.
- He qualified on the front row at Le Mans every year between 2011 and 2015.
- In 2016, he qualified fifth but crashed out of the race on the 16th lap when in third position.
- In 2017, he crossed the line in fourth place after qualifying sixth.
- In 2018, he qualified fifth and crashed out at La Chapelle just after taking the lead from his teammate Jorge Lorenzo.
- Last year, he qualified fourth, dropped down to seventh on the opening lap but eventually finished second after fighting with his teammate Petrucci in the late stages of the race.

## 9. Danilo Petrucci, Ducati Team – Age: 29 – Nationality: Italian

- In Petrucci's first race at Le Mans in 2012, he crashed on Lap 25 when he was the highest-placed CRT rider in 11th.
- He didn't start the race in France in 2014 as he had not fully recovered from his wrist injury suffered in Jerez.
- In 2015, he qualified in ninth position and finally finished the race in 10<sup>th</sup>.
- In 2016, he took part in his first race of the season after having suffered with a hand injury; he finished in seventh place as the top Ducati rider.
- In 2017, he retired after 17 laps due to a technical problem on his bike.
- In 2018, Petrucci qualified in third and finished the race in second, which was his only podium finish of the year.
- Last year, he qualified in second place, equalling his best qualifying result in MotoGP to date. He fought with in the early stages of the race, then teammate Dovizioso and eventually finished the race in third, which was his first podium since Le Mans in 2018.

## 20. Fabio Quartararo, Petronas Yamaha SRT – Age: 21 – Nationality: French

- Quartararo won in Le Mans in the CEV Moto3\* class back in 2014.
- In 2015, he qualified on pole position in Moto3\*, becoming the youngest ever rider to start back-to-back GP races from pole position and taking the record from Maverick Viñales. He crashed out of the race at the Dunlop chicane while fourth.
- In 2016, he qualified in eighth and crossed the line sixth; his best result in Grand Prix racing in Le Mans so far.
- In 2017, he failed to score any points at the French GP, crossing the line in 18<sup>th</sup> in Moto2\* after qualifying in 20<sup>th</sup>.
- In 2018, Quartararo qualified in 14<sup>th</sup> and made his way through the field to finish in eighth – his best result at that stage of the season.
- 2019 was Quartararo's first race at Le Mans on a MotoGP\* bike; he qualified in 10<sup>th</sup>, which is his worst qualifying so far (along with Brno last year). He ran off the track at Turn 8 at the beginning of the race and dropped down to 17<sup>th</sup>. He then made his way through the field to finish eighth.

## 27. Iker Lecuona, Red Bull KTM Tech 3 – Age: 20 – Nationality: Spanish

- Lecuona competed in Le Mans in Moto2\* over the last three years with a best result of ninth last year.
- In 2017, he withdrew from the French GP on Saturday after breaking his collarbone in FP3 when trying to avoid Alex Marquez, who crashed in front of him.
- 2020 will be Lecuona's first year competing in MotoGP\* in Le Mans.

## 5. Johann Zarco, Esponsorama Racing – Age: 30 – Nationality: French

- Zarco has competed at Le Mans for the last 11 years with a best result of second in 2017 in MotoGP\*.
- In 2017, he led the first six laps before dropping down to third; he eventually finished second after Rossi crashed out of the race on the final lap. This was his first podium in MotoGP\*.
- In 2018, he qualified on pole position for the first time in Le Mans but crashed out of second on the eighth lap.
- Last year, he qualified 14th using slick tyres in Q1, which was his best qualifying result at that time with KTM, and finished the race in 13th as the second KTM rider.

## 12. Maverick Viñales, Monster Energy Yamaha MotoGP – Age: 25 – Nationality: Spanish

- Viñales took his very first GP victory at the Le Mans circuit in 2011 in 125cc on what was only his fourth start.
- He qualified on pole in Moto3\* in 2013 and went on to win the race.
- In 2014 he finished fourth in the Moto2\* race.
- In 2015, Viñales qualified in 13th position and finished ninth in MotoGP\*.
- In 2016, he finished third, which was his first podium in MotoGP\* and Suzuki's first MotoGP\* podium in eight years.
- In 2017, he won for the fourth time in the premier class, from pole position, after battling with Rossi. It was Yamaha's 500th win in Grand Prix racing.
- In 2018, Viñales qualified in eighth place and dropped down to 13<sup>th</sup> before making his way through the field to cross the line in seventh.
- Last year, he qualified 11<sup>th</sup> after using the slick tyre at the beginning of Q2 in wet conditions. He crashed out of the race at Turn 12 on Lap 7, knocked out by Bagnaia.

## 21. Franco Morbidelli, Petronas Yamaha SRT – Age: 25 – Nationality: Italian

- Morbidelli competed at Le Mans from 2014 to 2017 in Moto2\*.
- Morbidelli won his fourth race in 2017 at Le Mans from third on the grid, which is his best qualifying result at the French circuit so far.
- 2018 was Morbidelli's first time on a MotoGP\* bike at the French GP; he qualified 16th and finished the race in 13th as the second rookie behind Hafiz Syahrin.
- Last year, he qualified sixth after passing through Q1 and eventually finished the race in seventh as the second Yamaha.

## 30. Takaaki Nakagami, LCR Honda Idemitsu – Age: 28 – Nationality: Japanese

- In 2013, Nakagami qualified on pole for the first time in his Grand Prix career, but he crashed out the lead at Muséee corner, 20 laps before the end.
- Nakagami's best result across the line at Le Mans is two fifths, in Moto2\* (2016) and in 125cc (2009).
- In 2017, Nakagami finished in seventh place from 18th on the grid in Moto2\*.
- 2019 was the first time that Nakagami competed in MotoGP\* at Le Mans; he qualified in 19<sup>th</sup> place after suffering from a heavy crash in FP2 and eventually scored one point, finishing the race in 15<sup>th</sup>.
- Last year, he qualified in seventh after crashing in Q2, which was his best qualifying in MotoGP\* at that time, but he crashed out of the race at Turn 11 on Lap 19 while sitting in 12<sup>th</sup>.

### 33. Brad Binder, Red Bull KTM Factory Racing – Age: 25 – Nationality: South African

- From 2012 to 2016, Binder raced in Moto3\* at Le Mans. He won the race in 2016 after qualifying in second position, on his way to clinching the title.
- In 2017, he missed the French GP (in Moto2\*) after finding the plate in his left arm injured in pre-season testing had moved at the Argentina GP and required further surgery. He missed Austin, Jerez and Le Mans and was replaced by Ricky Cardus.
- Over the last two years, he raced in Moto2\* at Le Mans with a best result of fourth in 2019.
- In 2020, Binder will be racing in Le Mans for the first time on a MotoGP\* bike.

### 35. Cal Crutchlow, LCR Honda Castrol – Age: 34 – Nationality: British

- Crutchlow raced at Le Mans for the first time in 2011; he qualified in sixth place on the grid and then crashed in the race at Garage Vert on the sixth lap.
- In 2013, he finished second, equalling his best GP result of 2013.
- In 2014 he finished 11th at Le Mans riding the factory Ducati.
- In 2015, he qualified in fourth place on the grid, but he crashed out of the race at La Chapelle on Lap 8, and he crashed again the following year this time at Turn 11.
- In 2017, he headed the second row on the grid and finished the race in fifth place.
- In 2018, he missed out on Q2 and qualified in 13th place, which was his worst qualifying result of 2018, but managed to finish the race in eighth place.
- Last year, he missed Q2 after crashing in FP2. He eventually qualified 15th, which was also his worst qualifying result of 2019, and finished the race in ninth after being passed by Quartararo in the latter stages of the race.

### 36. Joan Mir, Team Suzuki Ecstar – Age: 23 – Nationality: Spanish

- In 2017, Mir won the Moto3\* race on his way to clinching the title. The race was stopped by a Red Flag after a multiple crash on the second lap at La Chapelle and restarted for a shortened distance of 16 laps.
- In 2018, Mir qualified in fourth place and finished the Moto2\* race in third, which was the first of his four podium finishes in the class.
- 2019 was Mir's first race at Le Mans on a MotoGP\* bike; he qualified in 18<sup>th</sup>, but crashed on the warm up lap entering the Dunlop chicane. He started from pitlane and eventually finished the race in 16<sup>th</sup>.

### 38. Bradley Smith, Aprilia Racing Team Gresini – Age: 29 – Nationality: British

- Smith has finished on the podium twice at Le Mans in 125cc; third in 2007, which was his first GP podium, and second in 2008
- He finished ninth in 2013, his rookie season in MotoGP\*, after finishing the first lap down in 16th place.
- In 2015, he qualified sixth, and went on to finish the race in sixth after a battle with Marquez and Jannone.
- In 2016, he was sixth on the grid, his best qualifying of the year, but crashed out of the race from seventh position.
- In 2018, he ended the race in 13th, which was his best result at that time with the KTM RC16.
- In 2018, his last visit to the track in MotoGP\* (with KTM), he qualified in 17th place and finished the race in 14th.

### 41. Aleix Espargaro, Aprilia Racing Team Gresini – Age: 31 – Nationality: Spanish

- Aleix Espargaro's best GP result at Le Mans is sixth in 2011 (Moto2\*) and 2016 (MotoGP\*).
- In 2014, he was the first Open Class bike across the line in ninth place.
- In 2015, he had a big crash on Saturday and then retired from the race with a clutch problem after two laps.
- In 2017, he retired from the race five laps before the end with an engine problem.
- In 2018, he qualified in 12<sup>th</sup> and finished the race in ninth, which was the second time he had scored points since the opening race in Qatar.
- Last year, he qualified ninth, which was his best qualifying result of 2019 at that time. He dropped down throughout the race struggling with grip and finished the race in 12<sup>th</sup> (after being penalised 1.4 seconds at the end of the race due to a shortcut at Turn 9 and 10).

### 42. Alex Rins, Team Suzuki Ecstar – Age: 24 – Nationality: Spanish

- Rins competed three times at Le Mans in Moto3\* and finished on the podium every time: second in 2013 and 2014 and third in 2012, which was his very first podium in GP racing.
- He competed in Moto2\* in 2015 and 2016; starting from pole position in 2015 and winning the 2016 race from second on the grid.
- 2018 was the first time that Rins competed in MotoGP\* at Le Mans as he missed the race in 2017 due to a left wrist injury sustained in Austin and was replaced by Guintoli. He missed out on Q2, qualified 15<sup>th</sup> and crossed the line in 10<sup>th</sup> as the only Suzuki rider across the line.
- Last year, he qualified 19<sup>th</sup> after starting Q2 on wet tyres before switching to slicks and running out of time. He made his way through the field to finish 10<sup>th</sup> despite struggling on corner entries at the end of the race.

### 43. Jack Miller, Pramac Racing – Age: 25 – Nationality: Australian

- Miller won the Moto3\* race at Le Mans in 2014 from second place on the grid.
- In 2015 in MotoGP\*, he qualified 18th but then crashed out at the Dunlop chicane on Lap 15.
- In 2016, he crashed out of the race from 10th position on the 18th lap at Musée corner.
- In 2017, despite a heavy crash in FP4 at the Dunlop chicane, he finished the race in eighth from 11th on the grid.
- In 2018, Miller crossed the line in fourth as the second Independent Team rider, after qualifying seventh.
- Last year, he qualified third as the second Ducati rider behind Petrucci, despite a crash in Q2. He fought hard with Marc Marquez at the beginning of the race and eventually finished fourth as the third Ducati rider. This was the first time there were three Ducati riders within the top four across the line of a MotoGP\* race since Turkey 2007.

### 44. Pol Espargaro, Red Bull KTM Factory Racing – Age: 29 – Nationality: Spanish

- Espargaro won the 125cc race at Le Mans in 2010 – his only GP podium at the French circuit.
- He had his best result of 2014 at Le Mans, finishing fourth after qualifying on the front row for the first time in MotoGP\*.
- In 2015, he qualified down in 12th, but had a more successful race finishing in seventh place.
- In 2016, he qualified fourth and finished the race in fifth as the top Independent Team rider.
- In 2017, he qualified in eighth then finished 12th, which was the best result for KTM in MotoGP\* at that time.
- In 2018, he qualified 18<sup>th</sup> and made a good start to complete the opening lap in 12<sup>th</sup>, eventually finishing 11<sup>th</sup>.
- Last year, he qualified 12<sup>th</sup> after crashing on his second run in Q2. He was fifth on the second lap and eventually finished the race in sixth, which is KTM's best result so far at the track.

### 46. Valentino Rossi, Monster Energy Yamaha MotoGP – Age: 41 – Nationality: Italian

- Rossi has had 13 podium finishes in the premier class at Le Mans, including three victories; in 2002 riding a Honda, 2005 riding the 990cc Yamaha and in 2008 on Yamaha's 800cc machine.
- In 2009 he finished in 16th place, after suffering a crash and a ride through penalty; this was the first time he had ever finished a GP race outside the points.
- Two of his three podiums on a Ducati came at Le Mans; third in 2011 and second in 2012.
- He finished second in 2014, 2015, and 2016 in Le Mans.
- In 2017, he qualified second then he crashed out on the final lap while fighting teammate Viñales for the win.
- In 2018, Rossi qualified ninth and made his way through the field to finish in third.
- Last year, he got to Q2 after passing through Q1 (where he used slicks). He finished fifth as the top Yamaha rider.

### 53. Tito Rabat, Esponsorama Racing – Age: 31 – Nationality: Spanish

- Rabat has finished on the podium twice at Le Mans in Moto2; in 2014 he finished third and then in 2015 he finished second.
- In 2016, Rabat crashed out of the MotoGP® race on the eighth lap after having qualified in 20th place.
- In 2017, he qualified down in 22nd but managed to cross the line in 11th position, the only time so far he has scored points in MotoGP® at Le Mans.
- In 2018, he qualified 11<sup>th</sup>, went wide on the second lap to drop down to 22<sup>nd</sup> and then crashed out from 20<sup>th</sup> on Lap 11.
- Last year, he qualified 20<sup>th</sup> and retired from the race after two laps.

### 63. Francesco Bagnaia, Pramac Racing – Age: 23 – Nationality: Italian

- Bagnaia has had three podium finishes in Le Mans, including a win in the Moto2® race in 2018 from pole position.
- In 2017, he crossed the line in second place in Moto2®, after qualifying in second, which was his first front row start in the class.
- In 2015, Bagnaia both qualified and finished the race in third riding a Mahindra, which was the first podium finish of his Grand Prix career.
- In 2019, Bagnaia raced in Le Mans for the first time on a MotoGP® bike; he missed out on Q2 from Q1 and qualified in 13<sup>th</sup>. He crashed out during the race on Lap 7 while sitting in 15<sup>th</sup> place, knocking out Viñales in the process.

### 88. Miguel Oliveira, Red Bull KTM Tech 3 – Age: 25 – Nationality: Portuguese

- Oliveira has competed in Le Mans for the last nine years, with a best result of sixth in 2018 in Moto2® after qualifying in 10th place.
- His best result in Moto3® at Le Mans came in 2015, crossing the line in eighth from eighth on the grid.
- Last year, Oliveira raced in Le Mans for the first time on a MotoGP® bike; he crashed in Q1 using slick tyres and qualified in 16th place. He finished the race in 14th place (after being penalised 1.5 seconds at the end of the race for a shortcut at Turn 9 and 10).

### 6. Stefan Bradl, Repsol Honda Team – Age: 30 – Nationality: German

- Bradl has had a single podium finish at Le Mans: third in Moto2® in 2011, when he also started from pole.
- He qualified down in 13th for the MotoGP® race at Le Mans in 2012, after a crash in qualifying, but finished fifth in his first wet MotoGP® race.
- In 2013, he finished 10th at Le Mans after crashing and re-starting.
- In 2014, he headed the second row of the grid and held second early on before eventually finishing seventh.
- In 2015, he crashed out after losing the front end on the second lap at Turn 6.
- In 2016, his last visit to Le Mans in MotoGP®, he started from 17th on the grid and worked his way through the field to cross the line in 10th after bending his brake lever following contact with Barbera. This was Aprilia's best result at Le Mans at the time since Noriyuki Haga was eighth in 2003.
