4. Andrea Dovizioso, Ducati Team – Age: 34 – Nationality: Italian

- Dovizioso's only podium finish in the smaller classes at Valencia was in his Championship-winning season in 2004, when he finished second in 125cc.
- His first podium in MotoGP® here is third in 2011 riding a Honda when he also set the fastest lap of the race.
- In 2014, he was fourth and in 2015, he was the first Ducati rider across the line in seventh. He again finished seventh at the circuit in 2016.
- In 2017, he had a chance to clinch the title against Marquez, but he crashed out of on Lap 25 while sitting in fourth.
- In 2018, he qualified third and quickly moved up to second before the race was red flagged due to weather conditions. In the restarted race, he took the lead on Lap 2 and took the win, the first for Ducati at Valencia since Casey Stoner in 2008.
- Last year, he qualified sixth as the second Ducati rider and moved up to finish the race in fourth behind Miller.

5. Johann Zarco, Esponsorama Racing – Age: 30 – Nationality: French

- Zarco has ridden at Valencia for the last 11 years and has finished on the podium four times: third in 2013 & 2014 as well as a win in 2016, in Moto2®, and second in MotoGP® in 2017 after battling with Pedrosa on the final lap – which was Zarco's third podium finish in his rookie season in MotoGP®.
- In 2016, Zarco qualified on pole, took the win and set the fastest lap of the Moto2® race.
- In 2018, he qualified in 11th place and finished the restarted race in seventh place to clinch the title of top Independent Team rider.
- Last year, Zarco replaced Takaaki Nakagami at LCR Honda; he started from 13th before crashing out at Turn 6 with 14 laps to go while sitting in 11th.

9. Danilo Petrucci, Ducati Team – Age: 30 – Nationality: Italian

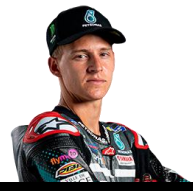
- Petrucci won the European Superstock 600 Championship race at Valencia in 2009.
- He raced in MotoGP® at Valencia for the first time in 2012 and had his best result of his rookie season, finishing in eighth place.
- In 2013, he finished 14th, and in 2014 he finished 12th having started the race down in 21st place on the grid.
- In 2015, he qualified and finished in 10th and in 2016, he qualified in 12th and finished in the same position.
- In 2017, he started his 100th GP race from 15th on the grid to finish the race in 13th as the second Ducati rider.
- In 2018, he qualified in fourth as the highest-placed Independent Team rider but crashed out of the race at Turn 13 while sitting in fifth.
- Last year, he started from 10th but his launch control failed and he lost some positions in the opening laps. He then made his way through the field before crashing out at Turn 6 while sitting in ninth with 14 laps to go.

12. Maverick Viñales, Monster Energy Yamaha MotoGP – Age: 25 – Nationality: Spanish

- Viñales has had two GP wins at Valencia: the 125cc race in 2011 and the Moto3® race in 2013 to win the world title.
- In 2014, he crashed out of the Moto2® race at the last corner of the first lap and collided with Mika Kallio.
- In 2015, he finished 11th after being pushed wide at the second corner and ending the first lap in 17th place.
- In 2016, he qualified in fourth place, was as high as third during the race but finished in fifth position.
- In 2017, he qualified in 13th and finished the race in 12th, which was his worst result across the line of the season.
- In 2018, he qualified on pole position for the first time since Aragon in 2017, but he crashed out on Lap 12 of the first race at Turn 14 while sitting fourth. He didn't start the second race.
- Last year, he qualified fourth and finished the race in sixth place, to finish third in the Championship.

20. Fabio Quartararo, Petronas Yamaha SRT – Age: 21 – Nationality: French

- Quartararo won the two CEV Moto3® races in Valencia in both 2013 and 2014 on his way to clinching both titles.
- From 2015 to 2018, he has raced in Valencia with a best result of sixth in Moto2® in 2018.
- In 2019, he returned to the Moto3® grid after missing the previous five races due to an ankle injury sustained at Misano.
- 2019 was Quartararo's first race in Valencia on a MotoGP® bike; he qualified on pole position for the sixth time in his rookie season in the class. He led the opening seven laps before being overtaken by M. Marquez and eventually finished the race in second – his seventh podium of 2019 – to clinch the title of top Independent Team rider.

21. Franco Morbidelli, Petronas Yamaha SRT – Age: 25 – Nationality: Italian

- Morbidelli competed five times at Valencia in Moto2® and finished twice on the podium; third in 2016 and second in 2017 in his final race in the class.
- In 2013, he qualified in third, which was the first front-row start of his Grand Prix career, and finished the race in 21st.
- 2018 was Morbidelli's first race in MotoGP® at Valencia; he qualified 15th, worked his way to fifth before he crashed on Lap 12. He didn't manage to get his bike to the box for the second start.
- Last year, he qualified fifth and dropped to eighth on the opening lap. He moved up to sixth before crashing at Turn 6 while sitting in sixth with nine laps to go.

- Lecuona has raced at Valencia from 2016 to 2019 in the Moto2® and he scored points only once: in 2018 when he finished in second place from 21st on the grid – the first of his two podium finishes to date.
- Last year, Lecuona raced at Valencia replacing Oliveira at Red Bull KTM Tech3. That was his first time on a MotoGP® bike; he qualified 19th, moved up to 15th during the race before crashing out at Turn 6 with 14 laps to go

- In 2018, Nakagami raced at Valencia for the first time on a MotoGP® bike; he finished in sixth place of the restarted race for his best result in his rookie season in the class.
- Last year, he missed the final three MotoGP® races of the season, including Valencia, following shoulder surgery; he was replaced by Zarco.

-Savadori has raced twice at Valencia in GP racing, in 125cc from 2008 to 2010 with a best result of 13th in 2008.

-From 2012 to 2016, Binder raced in Moto3™ in Valencia and won the race in 2016 (his title-winning season), which was his final win in the class before stepping up to Moto2™.
-Over the last three years, he raced in Moto2™ in Valencia and finished twice on the podium: third in 2017 (his third successive podium) and a win last year (his third successive win).

35. Cal Crutchlow, LCR Honda Castrol – Age: 35 – Nationality: British

-Crutchlow won the World Supersport race at Valencia in 2009 and finished seventh and ninth in the two World Superbike races in 2010 after qualifying on pole.
-In 2011 he finished fourth at Valencia – his best result in his rookie season in MotoGP™.
-In 2012 he crashed out on the 23rd lap when in second place.
-In 2013, he crashed out on the tenth lap, and in 2014 he finished fifth on his final ride with the Ducati factory team.
-In 2015, he had to start from the back of the grid after suffering technical problems; he finished the race ninth after ending the first lap in 24th place.
-In 2016, he crashed out at the final corner on Lap 17 and in 2017, he qualified in 16th after crashing in Q1, working his way through the field in the race to finish eighth.
-In 2018, he missed the Valencia GP due to a right ankle injury sustained at Phillip Island. He was replaced by Bradl.
-Last year, he crashed at Turn 10 in FP3, but managed to qualify in ninth. He crashed out of the race, losing the front at Turn 1 on Lap 11 while sitting in ninth place.

-In 2015, he finished eighth after battling for fourth in the early stages of the race.
-He qualified in ninth in 2016 and again finished the race in eighth.
-In 2017, he qualified eighth but crashed out on Lap 4.

43. Jack Miller, Pramac Racing – Age: 25 – Nationality: Australian

-Miller won the Moto3™ race in 2014 in Valencia – the first time he had completed a Grand Prix race at the circuit.
-In 2015, his rookie season in MotoGP™, he finished 21st and in 2016, he both qualified and finished the race in 15th position.
-In 2017, Miller qualified in 13th and finished seventh, and in 2018, he qualified in 10th after crashing in Q2, and crashed out of sixth at Turn 3 on Lap 5.

44. Pol Espargaro, Red Bull KTM Factory Racing – Age: 29 – Nationality: Spanish

-Pol Espargaro finished on the podium in Valencia twice in the 125cc class; third in 2009 and second in 2010.
-In 2012, he qualified on pole in Moto2™, then crashed on the eighth lap when battling for third place; restarting to finish eighth.
-He crashed again in 2013 after starting from pole, crashing on Lap 8 while leading and restarting to finish 29th.
-He finished sixth in 2014, and fifth in 2015 – his equal best result of that season.
-In 2016, he finished the race in sixth after having qualified in sixth for his last race with Monster Yamaha Tech 3.
-In 2017, he qualified in 11th, but had to start from the pitlane for exceeding his engine allocation. He then crashed out from 15th.
-In 2018, he qualified in sixth place and finished third despite crashing before the restart. It was the first podium finish for a KTM rider in the premier class and his first podium in MotoGP™.

46. Valentino Rossi, Monster Energy Yamaha MotoGP – Age: 41 – Nationality: Italian

- Rossi has had two MotoGP® victories at the Ricardo Tormocircuit, in 2003 on a Honda and in 2004 riding a Yamaha.
- In addition to the two victories, Rossi has had six other podiums at Valencia.
- In 2014, he qualified on pole and finished second – his first podium at the circuit since 2010.
- In 2015, he finished fourth despite starting the race at the back of the grid for his infringement in Malaysia, and in 2016 he again finished fourth.
- In 2017, Rossi qualified seventh and crossed the line fourth as the second Yamaha rider.
- In 2018, he qualified 16th, which, barring 2015 and his penalty, was his worst starting position at Valencia since he was 17th in 2007. He moved up to third in the early stages of the first race before the red flag. He crashed out of second at Turn 12 with five laps to go, remounting to finish 13th.
- Last year, he qualified 12th and crossed the line in eighth place

53. Tito Rabat, Esponsorama Racing – Age: 31 – Nationality: Spanish

- Rabat qualified on pole and finished second in the final race of his 2014 Moto2™ title-winning campaign – his first Grand Prix podium at the Valencia circuit
- In 2015, he qualified on pole, won the Moto2™ race and also set the fastest lap of the race.
- In 2016, he qualified 21st and after a good battle with Laverty finished in 17th.
- In 2017, he qualified 13th and dropped down to 18th on the opening lap but eventually finished the race in 10th, his third top 10 finish at that time in the premier class.
- In 2018, Rabat missed the Valencia GP due to a leg injury sustained at the British GP and he was replaced by Jordi Torres.

- Marquez has had two podiums in the smaller classes in Valencia: third in 2014 in Moto3™ and in 2018 in Moto2™.
- In 2014, he finished third behind winner Jack Miller and Isaac Viñales to clinch the title by two points over the Australian.
- Last year, he qualified in 15th position in Moto2 (his worst qualifying result of the season) and crashed on Lap 13 at Turn 11. He remounted his bike to finish his last Moto2™ race in 30th.
- In 2020, Marquez will be racing in Valencia for the first time on a MotoGP® bike; although he rode at the track during the Official Test last November where he set the 22nd fastest time overall.

88. Miguel Oliveira, Red Bull KTM Tech 3 – Age: 25 – Nationality: Portuguese

- Oliveira has had three GP wins in Valencia: in Moto3™ in 2015 when fighting for the title with Kent and in Moto2™ in 2017 (his third successive wins) and in 2018, which was his last win until he won the MotoGP® race in Styria this year.
- Last year, he missed the MotoGP® race in Valencia due to a right shoulder injury and he was replaced by Lecuona.
- In 2020, Oliveira will be racing at the Valencia GP for the first time on a MotoGP® bike.

6. Stefan Bradl, Repsol Honda Team – Age: 30 – Nationality: German

- Bradl has managed only three point-scoring finishes from his 11 Grand Prix start in Valencia: sixth in 2013, eighth in 2014, 13th in 2016 and ninth in 2018.
- He crashed out of the 125cc race in 2007 on the second lap, on the third lap in 2008 and made it to the ninth lap before crashing in 2009.
- In 2010 at Valencia, he crashed out of the Moto2™ race on Lap 12, and in 2011 he crashed on Lap 5, but still took the Moto2™ title as Marquez did not start the race due to injury
- In 2012, he crashed out of the MotoGP® race at Valencia on Lap 10 when in third place
- In 2015, he finished 18th in Valencia from 13th place on the grid
- In 2016 at Valencia, he qualified in 17th, worked his way through the field to finish the race in 13th, on his last appearance on the Aprilia.
- In 2018, his last visit to Valencia in MotoGP® when he replaced injured Crutchlow in LCR, he qualified in 20th and finished the race (which was interrupted due to the weather) in ninth.
